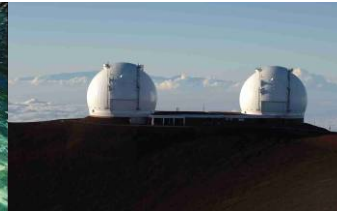

The Honolulu International airport (HNL) is served by many national and international carriers with many direct flights from major cities in the Asia Pacific region. Fares can vary widely so please book early for the most direct and cheapest fares. Flights from the Asia Pacific region cross the international dateline so many flights will arrive in Honolulu the same day you leave. Check carefully to coordinate your flights and hotel bookings. Also consider a side trip to some of the other Hawaiian islands during your trip to Hawaii. Entry into the US requires a valid passport and in many cases a valid [VISA](#). Meeting participants requiring a letter of invitation should contact Eric Jang, Chair organizing committee. Upon arrival foreign visitors will need to fill out an immigration form I-94, clear US immigration and US customs prior to exiting the airport area. Currency exchange is available inside the international arrival area and U.S. Customs area of the airport.
